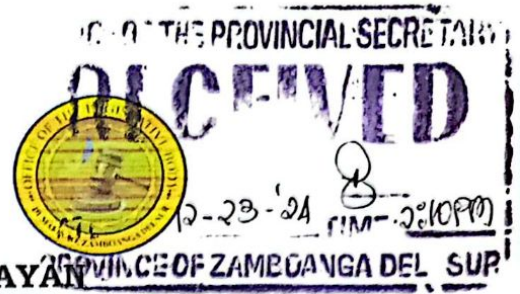

MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 2024-11-513

AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING PROPER MANAGEMENT, CONTAINMENT AND CONTROL OF AFRICAN SWINE FEVER (ASF) IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF DUMALINAO, ZAMBOANGA DEL SUR, IMPOSING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF, APPROPRIATING FUNDS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, Section 447, (a), (5), (xii) of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, provides that the Sangguniang Bayan, as the legislative body of the municipality, shall approve ordinances

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to provide measures and adopt quarantine regulations to prevent the introduction and spread of diseases;

WHEREAS, African Swine Fever (ASF) is a highly contagious viral disease affecting pigs, with significant economic impact on the swine industry and food security in the country;

WHEREAS, the Department of Agriculture (DA) has issued guidelines for the control, prevention, and eradication of ASF to prevent its spread to ASF-free areas;

WHEREAS, there is a need for a concerted effort among all stakeholders at the local level, particularly at the barangay level, to control and eradicate ASF, protect the swine industry, and ensure the safety of pork products;

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Dumalinao aims to strengthen local initiatives and establish a comprehensive mechanism to prevent and control the spread of ASF and, at the same time, to protect the livelihood of hog raisers;

NOW THEREFORE, on motion by **HON. ROMEO D. PARILA** and duly seconded by **HON. FREDERICK R. BALANDRA**;

BE IT ORDAINED by the 12th Sangguniang Bayan of Dumalinao in session duly assembled that:

SECTION I. SHORT TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as “Bantay African Swine Fever Ordinance”.

SECTION II. PURPOSE. This Ordinance shall provide policies and regulations geared toward prevention, management, and control of ASF by strengthening Biosecurity measures at the farm level and border control; intensifying awareness campaigns and capacity building of stakeholders; authorizing the use of resources for the effective implementation of this ordinance, as well as in mitigating the adverse impact on the affected stakeholders by, among others, indemnifying them in the event of depopulation or stamping out of affected or exposed pigs. A task force will likewise be created that shall be primarily responsible in the enforcement of this ASF Ordinance and other related laws applicable.

SECTION III. SCOPE AND LIMITATION. This Ordinance shall apply to intensified disease prevention and response within the Municipality of Dumalinao against ASF, where the Department of Agriculture, academe, private stakeholders and swine industry experts provide technical and support services to empower LGUs in the implementation of the “Bantay ASF sa Barangay” interventions at the farm and community levels.

SECTION IV. DEFINITION OF TERMS. For the purpose of implementing the provision of this Ordinance, the following terms shall mean:

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a. African Swine Fever (ASF) - is one of the most severe viral diseases of domestic and wild pigs/swine/hogs which is caused by a double stranded DNA which is robust and stable over a wide range of temperature and PH. Incubation period is 5-10 days and the symptoms of the disease include high fever, in appetite, external hemorrhagic lesions (red to violet blotches on the skin). This disease can spread through direct or indirect contact and causes 100% mortality.

b. Swine - or commonly referred to as hogs or pigs are any various stout-bodied short legged and hooved omnivorous with a thick bristly skin and a long flexible snout.

c. Red Zone - also known as infected zones. It comprises of cities and municipalities with confirmed cases of ASF or the "high risk areas.

d. Disease Surveillance - the systematic ongoing collection, collation and analysis of information related to animal health and the timely dissemination of information so that action can be taken.

e. Disease Monitoring - is the performance and analysis of routine measurements aimed at detecting changes in the environment or health status of the population.

f. ASF Free Certification - a document issued by the Bureau of Animal Industry to commercial farms certifying zero case of ASF among its live swine.

g. Genetic Material - for the purpose of this ordinance, this includes any material of a pig that carries genetic information that passes from one generation to another such as but not limited to breeder boar semen of pigs.

h. Swill Feeding - Feeding pigs w/ left over foods from Restaurants, Hotels and or any food establishments.

i. Biosecurity - refers to measures aimed at preventing the introduction and/or spread of harmful organisms to animals in order to minimize the risk of transmission of infectious disease. It is the prevention of disease-causing agents entering or leaving any place where they can pose a risk to farm animals, other animals, humans, or the safety and quality of a food product.

j. Footbath - is a useful and inexpensive method of cleaning footwear before entering and exiting production areas of a property.

k. Wheelbath - contains disinfectant to prevent the spread of potential infection being transferred by vehicle tyres.

l. Hog Traders - refers to any person, firm, or corporation engaged in the business or selling carcasses, parts of carcasses, meat, or meat food products derived from pigs, or otherwise negotiating purchases or sales of

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such articles other than for his own account or as an employee of another person, firm, or corporation.

m. Veterinary Biosecurity Officers (VetBO) – refers to a Resident Veterinarians or Veterinary Consultants recognized as Biosecurity Officers or VetBO registered and deputized to act as such and perform the duties and responsibilities stated in this Ordinance.

n. Selective Depopulation – is the rapid and deliberate killing of ASF infected, potentially infected, or contact animals with a defined coverage targeting identified, infected, and exposed animals in a specific animal facility or locality.

o. Test and Destroy – refers to the testing swine population and when found positive for ASF are subject for rapid, deliberate humane killing and proper disposal.

p. Barangay Biosecurity Officer (BBOs) – refers to Community/Village-Based Animal Technicians (CBAT), Barangay Animal Health Workers (BAHW), para-veterinary workers, Barangay Livestock Aide (BALA), volunteer veterinarian who are not resident or consulting veterinarian of any farm, or any person assigned by the municipality at the Barangay. They shall also be known as Barangay Biosecurity Officers or BBO who will be appointed, designated and registered as the frontliners of the Bantay ASF sa Barangay Program and shall have specific responsibilities indicated in this Ordinance.

q. Commercial Farm – refers to a farm category for any farm with a swine population that exceeds the definition of a small-hold farm. In high density areas, commercial farms are further classified into:

1. Semi-commercial Farm which refers to at least one of the following: between 10-50 sow level and between 41 to 500 fatteners.

2. Commercial Farm which refers to at least one of the following: 51 sow level and above and 501 fatteners and above.

r. Small-hold Farm – is commonly known as backyard farm, which refers to at least one of the following:

1. Less than 21 heads of adult and zero head of young (1-20 heads adult and zero young and below);

2. Less than 41 heads of young animals (1-40 heads young and below); and

3. Less than 10 heads of adult and 22 heads of young (1-9 heads adult and 1-21 heads young and below).

s. Bureau of Animal Industry (BAI) – is the primary agency mandated to control animal diseases in the country.

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t. Department of Agriculture (DA) – is an Executive Branch of the Philippine Government mandated to improve, upgrade and regulate the agricultural sector.

u. Department of Agriculture – National Livestock Program – is the national program of DA mandated to drive and catalyze the accelerated and sustainable development of the livestock and poultry sub sectors through the formulation of a comprehensive policy, preparation of plans, and implementation of programs and projects.

SECTION V. CREATION OF THE LGU-DUMALINAO ASF TASKFORCE.

There is hereby created the LGU-Dumalinao ASF Taskforce of the Municipality of Dumalinao. It shall be the main authority to oversee the implementation of this Ordinance and other related activities as may be provided by rules and regulations and guidelines promulgated by higher authority or mandated by the national laws and shall be composed of the following:

- Chairperson - Municipal Mayor
- Co-Chairperson - Chairman, SB on Committee on Agriculture
- Members:
 - Municipal Agriculturist
 - MDRRM Officer
 - MPDO
 - MENRO
 - LIGA ng mga Barangay President
 - Municipal Health Officer
 - MPS-Dumalinao, Chief of Police
 - Municipal Information Officer
 - Two (2) Accredited CSOs/NGOs
 - Market Supervisor
 - Slaughterhouse Inspector

The Task Force may include other agencies or stakeholders not mentioned in this Ordinance but would have an immense part in its implementation and who shall be named as the expanded members of the Task Force.

a. TECHNICAL SUPPORT TEAM. Rapid Action Team shall carry out the immediate diagnosis of suspect premises and the initiation and implementation of the stamping out procedures:

1. Municipal Veterinarian/Municipal Agriculturist;

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2. MDRRM Officer; and
3. MPS-Dumalinao Personnel.

b. SURVEILLANCE TEAM. The Surveillance Team shall conduct regular surveillance and profiling of swine diseases in the identified priority areas and composed of:

1. Municipal Veterinarian/Municipal Agriculturist;
2. MENRO;
3. Municipal Health Officer;
4. Market Supervisor; and
5. Slaughterhouse master.

c. QUARANTINE TEAM. The Quarantine Team shall conduct periodic identification and consolidation of data on swine population, location, and other areas:

1. Municipal Veterinarian/Municipal Agriculturist; and
2. MPS-Dumalinao Personnel.

d. CENSUS TEAM. The Census Team shall conduct periodic identification and consolidation of data on swine population, location, and other areas:

1. Municipal Information Officer;
2. Municipal Agriculturist; and
3. CSOs/NGOs.

e. IEC TEAM. The Information Education Campaign Team shall ensure adequate awareness of the general public matters and updates to African Swine Fever and the team shall from:

1. Municipal Veterinarian/Municipal Agriculturist;
2. MPDC;
3. Municipal Information Officer; and
4. CSOs/NGOs.

f. CAPABILITY BUILDING TEAM. The Capability Building Team shall conduct trainings and other similar activities to ensure that the stakeholders, including the barangay officials and personnel, are given ample knowledge on the roles and responsibilities they need to undertake and shall composed of:

1. Municipal Veterinarian/Municipal Agriculturist;

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2. Bureau of Animal Industry (BAI);
3. ATI; and
4. DA-RFO.

A Technical Working Group (TWG) headed by the Municipal Veterinarian or the Municipal Agriculturist and shall composed of government and private sector stakeholders may be created to serve as the advisory body of the Task Force for the efficient implementation of this Ordinance.

SECTION VI. FUNCTIONS OF THE LGU-DUMALINAO ASF TASK FORCE.

The main functions of the LGU-Dumalinao ASF Task Force include but are not limited to the following:

- a. Main implementer of the Bantay ASF Program;
- b. To formulate local issuances, ordinances, and contingency plans for the ASF prevention and control measures in the municipality;
- c. To initiate and coordinate all ASF-related activities including quick response, disease investigation, surveillance, animal movement control, information and education and logistics to relevant agencies such as the National, Regional, Provincial ASF Task Force;
- d. To conduct capacity building activities;
- e. To disseminate information, guidelines, and memoranda to all stakeholders;
- f. To regularly submit reports to the Local Chief Executive on the status of its activities.
- g. To perform such other functions as may be necessary for the full and proper implementation of ASF prevention and control protocols within the municipality.
- h. To recommend and implement measures to safeguard the privacy of data subjects consistent with Republic Act No. 10173, also known as the Data Privacy Act of 2012, its implementing rules and regulations that may be issued by the National Privacy Commission.

SECTION VII. AUTHORITY OF THE LGU-DUMALINAO ASF TASK FORCE.

The following are the regulatory, visitorial, seizure, confiscation, and control measures of LGU-Dumalinao ASF Task Force:

- a. **REGULATORY AUTHORITY** – the LGU-Dumalinao ASF Task Force shall have the authority to regulate the movement of live pigs, pork products, by products, and other products with pork ingredients in line with the national issuances and guidelines.

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b. **VISITORIAL POWER** – upon presenting appropriate credentials or authority to the owner, manager, operator, agent, or any person within the premises, the LGU-Dumalinao ASF Task Force shall have the power to enter and inspect swine farms and other related livestock establishments at any time during reasonable hours to conduct disease investigation, surveillance, monitoring and collection of laboratory specimens and samples, impose preventive and control measures therein, in coordinate with, and as may be necessary, subject to biosafety and biosecurity entry requirements of concerned farms and establishments.

c. **SEIZURE AND CONFISCATION** - The LGU-Dumalinao ASF Task Force shall have the authority to seize and confiscate animals, carcasses, products, and by product, feeds, feed ingredients, feed supplements and feed additives, vecum biologics, drugs, products and devices, and such other materials substances that are undocumented or of unknown source and conditions, and are showing signs of ASF, or reasonably suspected to be infected with or carriers of ASF, contaminated with ASF or posing an imminent danger, threat and injury to the overall animal health situation in their respective jurisdictions.

d. **ANIMAL CONDEMNATION AND OTHER DISEASE CONTROL MEASURES** – the LGU-Dumalinao ASF Task Force shall have the authority to institute condemnation and eradication measures on animals that are diseased or reasonably suspected to be infected with ASF, and are deemed a great risk to the swine population.

SECTION VIII. INTESIFIED RISK ASSESSMENT, SURVEILLANCE, AND MONITORING. The following are the ASF guidelines and procedure in conducting assessment, surveillance, and monitoring:

a. **DISEASE MONITORING.** The Biosecurity Officers (VetBO and BBO) shall conduct ASF negative monitoring on a weekly basis. Veterinary Biosecurity Officers (Resident and Consulting Veterinarian)/BBOs must submit weekly monitoring reports for commercial farms/Paiwi to the MAO/MVO. In some cases, trained BBOs can conduct the monitoring and reporting for semi-commercial farms up to 50 Sow level and Paiwi/Farms up to 500 heads with concurrence and approval by the LGU Veterinarian or his equivalent.

Biosecurity Officers must conduct and submit the Farm Biosecurity Evaluation Form for the farm to the MAO/MOV, which also serves as a basis of issuance/concurrence of Certificate of Weekly Disease Monitoring for African Swine Fever.

b. **DISEASE INVESTIGATION.** A disease investigation is prompted when there is a report of a suspect case of ASF in the area. The LGU-Dumalinao ASF Task Force in coordination with the Provincial ASF Task

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Force (PATF) and Regional ASF Task Force (RATF) shall act quickly on the reported case by conducting thorough disease investigation and sample collection.

Blood/organ samples to be collected for disease investigation shall come from 30 randomly selected animals preferably exhibiting clinical signs consistent with that of ASF, if the population is greater than 30. If the population is less than 30, samples shall be collected from all pigs in the farm.

The following are the ASF case definition as defined in the ASF Contingency Plan of the Bureau of Animal Industry (BAI):

1. Suspected Case – A case characterized by combination of the following signs:

- i. High fever (40.5-42 degrees C) and death in 2-10 days on average;
- ii. Reddening of the skin/purplish discoloration (white pigs), tips of ears, tail distal extremities, ventral aspects of chest and abdomen;
- iii. Vomiting, diarrhea (sometimes bloody) and eye discharges may exist;
- iv. Severe bleeding from nose and rectum;
- v. Nervous signs;
- vi. Up to 100% mortality among all ages in the production as the disease progresses; and
- vii. Sudden death without any clinical symptoms.

2. Probable Case – elements in the suspect case plus history of pig introduction, practice of swill feeding or pig access to garbage or rubbish dumps.

3. Confirmed Case – a detection of viral nuclei using Real Time Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR), and/or virus isolation which includes Convention PR and gene sequencing from:

- i. Animals with clinical and epidemiological evidence; and
- ii. Confiscated or surrendered meat, meat products, and by-products.

c. DISEASE SURVEILLANCE – for the purpose of this document, surveillance can be classified into:

1. Surveillance after an ASF is confirmed – this is conducted by the PVO/MAO/MVO within the 1 km quarantine area from the infected premises.

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2. Surveillance for local movement of animals – as part of the Early Warning System, surveillance must be regularly conducted for Red Zone (Infected and Pink Zones/Buffer) until zoning category is upgraded, unless otherwise stated in an applicable memorandum or orders. This is also a requirement for the issuance of Certificate of Free Status on ASF (CFS ASF), samples to be collected are:

i. Commercial Farm – 30 randomly selected samples conducted by Biosecurity Officers (15 adults and 15 young, which is 3-6 months old as per DA AC 12 Series of 2019. Endorsement of PVO/MVO/MAO to the laboratory is a must.

ii. Small-hold Farms – community sampling shall apply.

d. TEST AND DESTROY PROTOCOL. The Department of Agriculture AO No. 22, Series of 2020 “Guidelines on Swine Depopulation after ASF confirmation”, provides for Selective (Targeted) Depopulation where the rapid, deliberate humane killing and proper disposal of identified infected and exposed animals in a specific animal facility or locality is done, provided, factors that favors selective depopulation are met.

It also provides for the “Test and Destroy” general principle of case finding by means of laboratory testing and then culling of the test-positive animal. It clearly states that this is appropriate for the initial phase of the control program when the disease is spreading slowly and when the disease control officials opted to apply selective depopulation.

The Municipality of Dumalinao, through the MAO, and in coordination with the Department of Agriculture, Regional Field Offices (DARFOs), shall apply the selective depopulation using the Test and Destroy Protocol set by the LGU-Dumalinao ASF Task Force.

SECTION IX. ESTABLISHMENT OF MONITORING AND SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM. The LGU-Dumalinao, through the Office of the Municipal Mayor, Municipal Agriculturist, Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management, LIGA ng mga Barangay, meat vendors, hog traders, and other related stakeholders and the PP/PA shall establish and effective ASF monitoring and disease surveillance, disease reporting, disease investigation and disease response system and implement biosecurity protocols, zoning, recovery and repopulation.

Animal quarantine checkpoints, which shall regulate the entry and egress of hogs, pork, and products along possible entry points of swine shippers, shall be established, and activities and projects in the municipality for recovery and repopulation action areas shall be strengthened.

The establishment of Hog Industry Geotagging System is necessary to conduct the following:

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a. Updated Animal Inventory to be submitted to the Provincial Veterinary Office annually.

b. Master list of farmers including the name, barangay, animal inventory, coordinates, biosecurity level (must be RSBSA registered).

c. Incident cases/area mapping ASF-affected areas and other swine disease and traceability based on the submitted reports by the Task Force.

d. List of Barangay Biosecurity Officers endorsed by Municipal Mayor.

SECTION X. REGISTRATION AND DEPUTIZATION OF VETBOS AND BBOs.

The following are the registration and deputization of VetBOS and BBOs:

a. All VetBOS and BBOs shall registered and deputized by the Provincial Veterinary Office (PVO). VetBO shall apply directly to PVO, while BBO shall be assigned/endorsed by the MAO/MVO.

b. A certificate of training provided by Agricultural Training Institute-International Training Center on Pig Husbandry (ATI-ITCPH) Agricultural Training Institute – International Training Center (ATI-RTC) shall be issued as a proof that they have attended the training.

c. Biosecurity Officers must have their Biosecurity Officer Code to be issued by the PVO. For VetBO, registration may be online directly to the PVO, while for BBO the CVO/MVO/MAO will endorse the list of registered BBO to be issued a Biosecurity Officer Code by the PVO.

d. To fast track the implementation of this activity, all existing networks of Animal Health Workers such as Barangay Animal Livestock Aide (BAIA), Barangay Animal Health Workers (BAHWs), and other similar barangay officials assigned to assist in the implementation of different health program shall be readily designated for this purpose.

SECTION XI. ISSUANCE OF HOG TRANSPORT PASS. This aims to properly register all hog traders and other logistical support providers and their respective transport vehicles and vessels transacting business in the respective municipalities with the end view of traceability and maintaining disease free areas thereby achieving safe, clean, and orderly handling of commodities throughout the signes of marketing or distribution channels.

a. No hog traders and livestock transport carriers shall be allowed to transact business within the municipality without the Hog Transport Pass (HTP), which shall be a requirement before issuance of Veterinary Health Certificate (VHC).

b. All livestock transport carrier are required to comply with biosecurity measures such as cleaning and disinfection as maybe imposed by authorities.



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c. Any violation in this Ordinance by the Hog Traders and other logistical support providers shall immediately render his/her HTP revoked.

d. An updated list of traders shall be submitted regularly by the BLGU to the MAO, DARFO, and the BAI for the issuance of hog transport pass in accordance with Annex 6 of DA AO No. 7 Series of 2021.

e. Ensure that no hog traders and livestock transport carriers shall be allowed to transact business within the municipality without the Hog Transport Pass (HTP) which shall be a requirement before issuance of Veterinary Health Certificate (VHC) or Livestock Inspection Certificate (LIC).

SECTION XII. OBLIGATIONS OF HOG TRADERS. As a biosecurity measure and to control the proliferation of ASF, hog traders are required to conduct regular disinfection of the vehicles used to transport live and slaughtered hog. They shall also report information of suspected cases of ASF in the Municipality of Dumalinao and nearby municipalities. They must adhere to the policy of All-in All-out practice in delivery, which requires that there shall be no staggered delivery of pigs for slaughter at the Dumalinao Slaughterhouse Abattoir, as stipulated also in the shipping permit.

SECTION XIII. ESTABLISHMENT OF CHECKPOINTS. Checkpoints shall be established at all entry/exit points of the Municipality of Dumalinao, to be manned by Biosecurity Officers, CVO STAFF, Policemen, Barangay Tanod and Public Safety Office personnel, as appropriate. Personnel at the checkpoint shall ask and check for the following documents:

a. Live Pigs for Slaughter - The livestock dealer should present a dated and valid shipping permit. Documentary requirements in acquiring a local shipping permit from BAI, NVQS, DA-RFO IX:

1. Animal Welfare Registration Certificate (for Commercial Farms);
2. Veterinary Health Certificate/ Livestock Inspection Certificate;
3. Livestock Transport Carrier Registration;
4. Livestock Handlers License; and
5. Certificate of Free Status for ASF.

b. Pork Product – Fresh, Frozen pork products:

1. Meat Inspection Certificate for locally sourced meat;
2. Certificate of Meat Inspection (COMI) for imported meat; and
3. Shipping Permit.

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c. Uncooked Processed Pork Product - such as but not limited to Longganisa, chorizo, Tocino, Siomai:

1. License to operate (LTO); and
2. Shipping Permit.

d. Cooked and Canned Processed Meat Products - (Processed Meat subjected to temperature at least 70'c for 30 minutes such as but not limited to hotdogs, ham, chicharon, lechon and other canned pork products):

1. License to operate (LTO)-issued by a duly authorized government office/agency; and
2. Shipping Permit.

SECTION XIV. LEAD THE RECOVERY AND REPOPULATION. The sentinel program for ASF Infected Areas.

a. Letter of Intent to Undergo Exit from Quarantine Protocol.

b. Cleaning and disinfection of all facilities of the farms within 1km radius of infected premise.

c. Validation of cleaning and disinfection, which must have negative laboratory results on ASF:

1. Bioassay 1 at day 7 after cleaning and disinfection;
2. Bioassay 2 at day 14 after cleaning and disinfection; and
3. Bioassay for all the farms within 300 meters of infected premise.

d. Sentinel Animals, which must have negative laboratory results on ASF:

1. Screening Test at day 7;
2. Screening Test at day 21; and
3. PCR Test at day 40.

SECTION XV. ISSUANCE AND RENEWAL OF CERTIFICATE OF FREE STATUS ON AFRICAN SWINE FEVER (CFS-ASF). CFS-ASF is only applicable for ASF infected areas or the Red Zones and Pink or Buffer Zone.

a. Movement of animals from the ASF-Free or Green Zones are not restricted hence they are not required to secure CFS-ASF.

b. Issuance of CFS-ASF is subject in adapt to ASF testing requirement and guidelines, as deemed necessary by DA BAI.



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c. Issuance of CFS-ASF for commercial farms shall be at the BAI and/or Department of Agriculture Regional Field Office as directed by the Department of Agriculture Memorandum Order No. 41 Series of 2020, Delegation Authority to Issue/Approve Certificate of Free Status on African Swine-Fever (CFS-ASF). A negative PCR test shall automatically be issued a CFS-ASF.

d. Issuance of CFS-ASF for Barangay/Semi-Commercial/Small Hold Farm, is through clustering as approved by the Department of Agriculture Regional Field Office, which must be endorsed by the Office of the Municipal Agriculturist.

SECTION XVI. CONFISCATION OF SWILL/FOOD SCRAP. Swill or food scrap entering the municipality coming from any source including restaurants, hotels or any food establishments intended for swine feeding shall be confiscated to prevent the incursion of ASF.

SECTION XVII. PREVENTION OF SHORTAGE OF PORK SUPPLY. To prevent the shortage of pork supply, provided Municipality of Dumalinao remains an ASF-Free, it shall allow the transport of properly documented ASF-Free hogs, pork, and pork products coming from ASF-Free Zones and passing through its territorial jurisdiction going to other municipalities.

In case the Municipality of Dumalinao is an infected by an ASF Zone, it shall allow the entry of documented ASF-Free breeder stocks from ASF-Free Zone going to an ASF-Free farm outside the quarantine area, provided accompanied by proper documents issued by the concerned offices.

SECTION XVIII. RECOVERY AND REPOPULATION. The recovery and repopulation will be a part of a progressive control pathway wherein stages will be set to progressively ensure a particular area previously affected is already clear from any circulating virus, and ready for repopulation. It will have, as the main component, the following areas:

a. Procedure on upgrading from Red Zone (Infected) to Pink Zone (Buffer).

1. There must be no new ASF outbreaks within the previously ASF affected barangay as evidenced by weekly negative monitoring and active surveillance using any BAI validated/accredited screening test kit;

2. Within 1 km, active surveillance through the community sampling every 30 days until released quarantine (if there is existing swine farm in the area);

3. Outside 1 km, active surveillance through the community sampling every 30 days, must be performed until the farm can be released from quarantine. Weekly monitoring reports for all barangays in the municipality must be submitted;

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4. The owner must agree to strictly follow the protocol for repopulation, biosecurity, monitoring, and surveillance;

5. Sentinel animals must show NEGATIVE results in PC Test for ASF prior to repopulation; and

6. The complete guidelines and procedures for the recovery and repopulation is presented.

b. Restocking to full capacity will be allowed when the Red Zone category of an area is upgraded to Pink Zone, provided, all the provisions below are complied with:

1. The farm must registered to the municipality, acquire necessary permits, and licenses, before proceeding with swine raising pursuant to Municipal Ordinance No. 2024-04-506;

2. Facilities must conform to Municipal Ordinance No. 2024-04-506 and to the minimum biosecurity standards for swine farm (commercial and small-hold);

3. Acceptable animal waste disposal system (Municipal Ordinance No. 2024-04-506);

4. The farm must be repopulated at least 50% of the farm capacity only locally declared ASF-Free barangay in a Red Zone municipality;

5. Full capacity of the farm population for LGUs can be granted if the LGU can be reclassified from Red Zone to Pink Zone (locally declared ASF-Free municipality);

6. Include negative result in screening test for new raisers;

7. The farm owner must agree to regular farm visitation for animal health monitoring, surveillance and biosecurity evaluation;

8. Train farm owner and staff/personnel in Biosecurity;

9. Biosecurity Officers (BBO/VetBO) will monitor the farms and submit weekly monitoring reports;

10. Biosecurity evaluation will be done every six (6) months;

11. The farm barangay will undergo semi-annual testing (random) upon upgrading of zone category from Red to Pink Zone; and

12. The farm barangay shall be required to secure CFS-ASF six months upon lifting from Red to Pink Zone, and every six months (semi-annual) thereafter. Certificate of weekly monitoring issued by LGU for the last six months, a negative PCR test results for ASF and farm biosecurity evaluation/farm profile shall be required for the issuance of CFS-ASF.

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SECTION XIX. DECLARATION OF THE EXISTENCE OF AFRICAN SWINE FEVER AND DECLARATION OF ASF FREE DUMALINAO. Upon confirmation of the Department of Agriculture - Regional Field Office IX, and with recommendation from the LGU-Dumalinao ASF Task Force, the Municipal Mayor shall issue an executive order on the existence of ASF within the locality or nearby locations that warrants quick response due to imminent danger that can be caused by the disease in the local swine industry and hog farmers. The Municipal Mayor shall likewise issue an order declaring the Dumalinao as "ASF Free" once the Department of Agriculture or BAI confirmed that the disease ceased or was totally eradicated.

SECTION XX. DECLARATION OF ASF FREE STATUS. There are two levels of declaration of ASF Free Status on an area previously infected with ASF

a. The first level is the Municipal Level Local Declaration of ASF Free Status for the municipality with certain barangay/s, which have been previously infected with ASF and will be declared ASF area by the Provincial ASF Task Force. In the case the entire municipality had been affected by an ASF outbreak, the following documents must be submitted by the MAO/MVO to the Provincial ASF Task Force:

1. Letter of intent to be classified as an ASF Free area;
2. Supporting documents showing that farm/s in the barangay/s with previously reported ASF case shall strictly follow protocol for repopulation, biosecurity, monitoring, and surveillance:
 - i. Narrative report of the procedures used to recover the Red Zone (Section 7.1 of DA AO No. 07);
 - ii. Laboratory results of surveillance;
 - iii. Biosecurity level of the barangay farm at least level 1;
 - iv. Weekly negative reports submitted by the municipality to PVO on a regular basis.
3. Previously, ASF-infected barangays that were endorsed by the MAO/MVO to be free from ASF, as evidenced by the submitted supporting documents, shall be issued a Certificate to Repopulate from the Provincial ASF Task Force. This is a requirement before restocking.
4. Certificate of ASF Free Status will be issued by Provincial ASF Task Force if all of the infected farms in the municipality have been cleared for restocking purposes.
5. The Zoning category of the municipality shall be also be upgraded from Red to Pink through the ASF Zoning Map issued by the DA BAI.

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b. The second level is the National Declaration of ASF Free Status for the whole Province to be declared by the Bureau of Animal Industry.

All infected barangays of the municipality must be locally declared ASF Free are prior to application to be declared ASF Free on a national level. The guidelines for Declaration of ASF Free Status is subject to adapt as deemed necessary by DA-BAI.

SECTION XXI. PROHIBITED ACTS. The following are the prohibited acts of this Ordinance:

a. No person shall move pigs from sources affected by ASF without accompanying necessary permit/document.

b. No person shall be allowed to transport all pigs, pork products and by-products uncooked, cooked, processed and raw without accompanying necessary permit/document.

c. No person or any entity is allowed to transport swill, pig manure and the like.

d. No person shall tamper or falsify documents such as but not limited to:

1. Veterinary Health Certificate;
2. Shipping Permit;
3. Laboratory test results for ASF;
4. License to Operate/Certificate of Meat Inspection;
5. No person/entity shall remove diseased animals from quarantine areas.
6. No person or entity shall unduly interfere with authorities during enforcement.
7. No person shall refuse farm inspection and conduct of disease surveillance.
8. Holding pens for pigs intended for slaughter is strictly prohibited.

SECTION XXII. SLAUGHTERING REGULATIONS. If the source of the swine is within the Municipality of Dumalinao, the buyer and seller shall secure Barangay Certification stating their names and addresses as well as the source of the pig. This certification shall be presented to the ante mortem meat inspector of the Municipal Agriculture Office. If warranted free from ASF, a Veterinary Health Certificate or Livestock Inspection Certificate is issued upon payment of fees, to wit:

SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF DUMALINAO, ZAMBOANGA DEL SUR

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1. 1 to 5 heads of pig - One hundred pesos (Php100.00).
2. 6 to 10 heads of pig - Two hundred pesos (Php200.00).
3. 11 heads and above - Three hundred pesos (Php300.00)

The Municipal Agriculture Office shall be authorized to collect the aforementioned fees through an authorized bonded personnel to be designated. Such authority to collect shall be included in the Local Revenue Code.

If the source of the swine is outside in the municipality, the buyer and seller shall secure a Barangay certification from the source stating their names and addresses and sources of the pigs for slaughter. They shall also secure a Livestock Inspection certificate from the Municipal Agriculture Office where the source of pig was located. These two documents are required to get Shipping Permit at the Bureau of Animal Industry (BAI), National Veterinary Quarantine Services (NVQS), DA- RFO IX, Pagadian City. Said permit will be presented to the ante mortem meat inspector at Municipal Agriculture Office prior to admittance at the Dumalinao Slaughterhouse.

Entry at the Dumalinao Slaughterhouse will be denied if no proper documents are presented during the Ante Mortem Inspection.

SECTION XXIII. TRAINING AND CAPACITY BUILDING. Training and Capacity Building for all concerned enforcers of this Ordinance. There must be a capability building and training to the members of the Task Force as the identification of the disease, documentary requirements at the checkpoints, biosecurity, containment of the disease, proper disposal of confiscated and condemned pigs, to be conducted by the Bureau of Animal Industry (BAI); National Veterinary Quarantine Services (NVQS); National Meat Inspection Service; Regulatory Services of the Department of Agriculture; and the Municipal Agriculture Office.

The LGU-Dumalinao ASF Task Force together with its network of Provincial ASF Task Force (PATF) will coordinate with relevant to BABay ASF will be cascaded and disseminated to the farmers.

a. The LDATF will also work with the allied industries including the feed and nutrition companies and those that cater small hold farmers, to ensure biosecurity protocols are duly observed by the farmers. This will also be used as an area to discourage the use of swill as feed for hogs. Similarly, the LDATF will use these engagements to bring farmers to register in the Farmers Registry developed for livestock farmers.

b. Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) materials will be produced and distributed to all concerned BLGUs, other stakeholders and interested partners. Multimedia support will also be tapped.

SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF DUMALINAO, ZAMBOANGA DEL SUR

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c. Engagement of agencies including the DA Communication Group, Agriculture and Fisheries Information Division (AFID), Regional Agriculture and Fisheries Information Section (RAFIS), Agricultural Training Institute (ATI) and Local Government Information Officer, and all media resources of government shall be involved.

SECTION XXIV. APPROPRIATION OF FUND AND ASSISTANCE TO AFFECTED HOG RAISERS.

In the event of ASF outbreak in the municipality, whereby depopulation or stamping out of affected swine is conducted, an ASF Quick Response Fund shall be allocated out of the Office of the Municipal Agriculture fund to indemnify affected hog raisers.

Indemnification assistance shall be provided to the affected hog raiser whose hogs were culled or depopulated, to wit:

- a. One thousand pesos (P 1,000.00) per suckling piglet;
- b. Two thousand pesos (P 2,000.00) per weaned to grower and fattener pigs;
- c. Three thousand pesos (P 3,000.00) for pregnant sows.

Payment shall be made within two weeks after culling or depopulation protocol.

SECTION XXV. MANNER OF DISPOSAL OF SUSPECTED ASF CONTAMINATED SWINE AND CONFISCATED SWINE AND PORK PRODUCTS AND BYPRODUCTS. All swine suspected or confirmed to have been contaminated by ASF shall be confiscated in favor of the Local Government and shall be disposed of in a manner as may be allowed under the existing laws, administrative rules, and the regulations.

All swine and/or pork products and by-products confiscated or reasonably taken into custody, even when found negative or clear of ASF virus, shall likewise be appropriately disposed.

SECTION XXVI. PENALTY PROVISION. Violation of this Ordinance shall subject the offender/s to the following penalties, to wit:

- a. First Offense – One Thousand Pesos (Php1, 000.00) fine and confiscation with 3 days holding of vehicle.
- b. Second Offense – One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (Php1, 500.00) fine and confiscation with 10 days impounding of vehicle.
- c. Third Offense – Two Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (Php2, 500.00) fine and confiscation with 1 month impounding of vehicle.

SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF DUMALINAO, ZAMBOANGA DEL SUR

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Administrative fines shall be paid to the Municipal Agriculture Office or Municipal Treasurer Office prior to release of impounded vehicle. Non-payment of prescribed penalties may be used as basis for future disallowance at Dumalinao Slaughterhouse aside from other admin remedies.

SECTION XXVII. The budgetary requirements for the implementation and prevention of this Ordinance will be provided by the LGU-Dumalinao through allocation of funds for the use of operating expenses and incentive and/or compensation allowance for the "BABay ASF members".

SECTION XXVIII. IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS. The Municipal Mayor in coordination with Municipal Agriculture Office shall formulate the necessary rules and regulations for the effective implementation of this Ordinance within 60 days from its approval.


SECTION XXIX. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any provision of this ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the other provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION XXX. REPEALING CLAUSE. All ordinances, resolutions, executive orders, and other issuances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.


SECTION XXXI. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect upon review and approval.
