

MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 2024-02-503

AN ORDINANCE MANDATING THE ENFORCEMENT OF PRE-EMPTIVE AND FORCED EVACUATION DURING EMERGENCY SITUATIONS CAUSED BY MAN-MADE OR NATURAL DISASTERS AND PROVIDING ADDITIONAL GUIDELINES THEREOF, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE ORDINANCE NO. 2017-05-415 AND ORDINANCE NO. 2017-05-419 OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF DUMALINAO, ZAMBOANGA DEL SUR.

WHEREAS, under Section 444, (b), (1) (vii) of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, states that, "the Municipal Mayor is mandated to carry such emergency measures as may be necessary during and in the after-math of man-made and natural disasters and calamities";

WHEREAS, Section 447, (1), (iv), in the same above Code and pursuant to Section 16, empowers the Sangguniang Bayan, as the legislative body of the municipality to enact ordinances to adopt measures to protect the inhabitants of the municipality from the harmful effects of man-made or natural disasters and calamities and to provide relief services and assistance for victims during and in the aftermath of said disasters or calamities and in their return to productive livelihood following the said events;

WHEREAS, while it is the objective of the LGU-Dumalinao to have zero casualty, there is a need to enforce and adopt guidelines in order to properly implement and, at the same time, to mitigate the effects of man-made and natural disasters and calamities;

WHEREAS, it is settled that the government is under obligation to protect human lives at all times during the severity and magnitude of disasters renders its effective response beyond the capabilities of the government;


NOW, THEREFORE, on motion by **HON. JELITO R. PEÑONAL** and severally seconded by the August body;

BE IT ORDAINED by the 12th Sangguniang Bayan of Dumalinao, Zamboanga del Sur, in session assembled that:

SECTION I. TITLE. This ordinance shall be known as the additional guidelines of Preemptive and Force Evacuation of the Municipality of Dumalinao, Zamboanga del Sur.

SECTION II. DEFINITION OF TERMS. Additional terms, as used in this ordinance and hereby defined as:

- a. Evacuation Sites/Centres Pre-identified public buildings such as government buildings, elementary and high school buildings, halls, sports facilities, covered courts, or private facilities with permission from the owner of the facility.
- **b. Pre-emptive Evacuation** Evacuation ordered in response to a forecast threat or emergency which may cause disruption to the normal function of society, there is risk to the lives, livelihood and properties of the persons living in the affected areas.




- c. Forced Evacuation Evacuation ordered as a resort when a disaster or emergency has been declared and danger of loss of life is imminent, conditions exist that critically imperil or endanger the lives of those in the affected area.
- d. Incident Management Team shall mean any concerted effort by the two (2) or more agencies, public or private, to provide assistance or intervention before, during, or immediately after a disaster to meet the life preservation and basic subsistence needs of those people affected and in the restoration of public activities and facilities.
- e. Vulnerable or Marginalized Groups Individuals or groups of people that face higher exposure to disaster risk and poverty including but not limited to women, especially pregnant women, youth, children, orphans, or unaccompanied children, differently-abled people, indigenous people, disadvantaged families and individuals living in high risk areas and danger zones.
- **f. Forecasted/Expected Risk** The existence of an identified risk which could be expected to cause disruption to the normal function of society and may cause damage to life, livelihood, and property without proper intervention.
- g. Designated Assembly Area shall mean barangay halls or outposts as pick-up points during the execution of pre-emptive and forced evacuation.

SECTION III. TRAINING AND ORIENTATION ON PRE-EMPTIVE AND FORCED EVACUATION PROCEDURES. – The Municipal Mayor shall ensure that training and orientation on the possible natural hazards, vulnerabilities, and climate change risks, as well as the knowledge management activities on disaster risk reduction and management, are organized and conducted by the LDRRMC and BDRRMC, as the case may be. The Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (LDRRMO) shall organize and facilitate regular training, drills, simulation exercises, and orientation at least once a year on pre-emptive and forced evacuation on possible human-induced and natural hazards.

During the aforesaid trainings and orientations, the LDRRMO shall also discuss and highlight in a dialect understandable and spoken by the residents topics on RA 10121, otherwise known as the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010; DILG MC No. 2012-35 dated February 21, 2012 regarding the Guidelines in Ensuring Public Safety During Man-Made and Natural Disasters; this Ordinance; and other laws, rules and regulations on disaster risk reduction and management.

The LDRRMO shall formulate a standard operating procedure of pre-emptive and forced evacuation separate from this ordinance and also conceptualize posters, newsletters, brochures, and pamphlets regarding disaster risk reduction and management and cause the same to be posted at the conspicuous places of the municipality and/or, if possible, disseminate through social media, news, and other social platforms.

SECTION IV. IMPLEMENTATION OF PRE-EMPTIVE AND FORCED EVACUATION. Upon recommendation of the Incident Management Team, the Local Chief Executive may, after due consultation, coordination, and reference with the members of the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (LDRRMC), will order the pre-emptive and forced evacuation when a disaster or emergency has been forecasted and the disruption and risk to life, livelihood, and property are expected or imminent within the area of jurisdiction of the Municipality of Dumalinao, Zamboanga del Sur.

The Municipal Mayor, upon the recommendation of the LDRRMC and/or in consultation with the different government agencies concerned and field personnel, after it has been determined that the danger is no longer exist therein.

SECTION V. CONSIDERATIONS IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PRE-EMPTIVE AND FORCED EVACUATION. The rules to be observed in the implementation of pre-emptive and forced evacuation shall include but shall not be limited to the following:

1. PRE-EMPTIVE EVACUATION.


- a. The order for pre-emptive evacuation shall be announced to the vulnerable or marginalized groups in the area who will be affected at least eight (8) hours before the commencement of the pre-emptive evacuation operation to give the affected individuals or groups a time to prepare their needs or belongings.
- b. Vulnerable or marginalized groups in the identified danger zones or areas that are to be affected by the incoming typhoon or any other identified situation or event that may cause a disaster shall be temporarily relocated to evacuation sites or centres.
- c. Assistance from the private sector such as private schools and/or barangays shall be secured if the situation warrants. Particularly, temporary use of their halls, sport facilities or auditorium may be requested if the need arises and if a shortage of evacuation sites exists.



- d. Each barangay, as per their approved Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (BDRRM) Plan and Contingency Plans, shall have a designated area/pick-up points from which they will be transported to their designated evacuation center.
- e. Incident Management Team will enlist the assistance of its supporting agencies, such as, the Philippine National Police (PNP), Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP), Coast Guard, Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), Municipal Engineering Office (MEO), LDRRMO, MSWDO, BDRRMC or any accredited community disaster volunteers in ensuring the safety and security of the affected residents during the enforcement and/or implementation of the pre-emptive evacuation before the disaster or calamity situation.
- f. Strict enforcement of the pre-emptive measures shall be done on the area/s affected or to be affected by man-made or natural disaster. The Barangay Chief Executive or any of barangay officials, who will as much as possible, be responsible in leading the response team composed of LDRRMC team, the PNP or any enforcement agency, local rescue teams or volunteers. In case the concerned barangay officials and members of the BDRRMC are affected during the disaster or emergency situation, the DREAM ALPHA protocol shall be observed during the implementation of pre-emptive and forced evacuation. The responses shall make sure that no person has been left unaccounted in the area or allowed to return in the affected area without an order issued to this effect.
- g. The Local Chief Executive may mobilize individuals or organize volunteers to augment their personnel and logistical requirements for pre-emptive evacuation activities.
- h. Once the pre-emptive evacuation has commenced, priorities shall be given to the following: 1. The sick and elderly people; 2. Differently-abled people; 3. Pregnant women and children; and 4. Indigenous People.
- i. Residents shall only be allowed to return or go back their homes upon the order of the Municipal Mayor upon recommendation of the LDRRMC and/or in consultation with the different government agencies concerned and field personnel, after it has been determined that the danger is no longer exist therein.

2. FORCED EVACUATION.

a. Forced Evacuation procedure will be resorted to in cases where the residents of the affected area have refused to leave their homes, if the forecasted impact of disaster is within less than five (5) hours and/or there is imminent danger to life, livelihood and property within the area of jurisdiction.







- b. Forced Evacuation may be conducted upon the recommendation of the LDRRMC after due consultation, coordination, and reference with the members of the Incident Commander (IC) when the disaster or emergency has been declared and the danger of loss of lives and damage to livelihood and property is imminent within the area of jurisdiction of the LGU-Dumalinao. However, immediately after the declaration of forced evacuation but before actual enforcement thereof, the IC shall see to it that local residents are informed in dialect understandable and spoken by the residents of the need for them to evacuate and that there is no other alternative way to ensure their safety.
- c. Forced Evacuation shall be carried out in a manner that is humane, respectful of the dignity of a person, not using disproportionate force, without discrimination and with conscious attention to the needs of vulnerable sectors such as children, women, the elderly and persons with disabilities.
- d. Personnel and volunteers carrying out the forced evacuation shall ensure that all measures are taken to inform the evacuees, in a manner and language that they can understand of the need for the evacuation, and the lack of other alternative for their evacuation.
- e. If any from the vulnerable or marginalized groups does not adhere to the order of forced evacuation and found within the danger or target area, he/she may be arrested and forcibly be taken as a means of ensuring his/her safely.

A person shall only be allowed to return or go back to their homes, if still possible, upon the order of the Municipal Mayor through recommendation by LDRRMC, in consultation with different government agencies concerned, after it has been determined that danger no longer exists therein.

- f. Personnel and volunteers carrying out the forced evacuation shall comply with other rules being promulgated by the Commission on Human Rights (CHR) for the protection of human rights of all persons.
- g. Upon the declaration of forced evacuation, any person shall be prohibited from staying in the forecasted impact area except the ARDANA Team, Security Team, and other authorized response groups in order to secure the lives as well as the properties from looting, theft, robbery, etc. in the affected areas.

SECTION VI. PROHIBITION OF FISHING VESSELS AND FISHING ACTIVITIES. Unless otherwise pronounced by the Headquarters of the Philippine Coast Guard (HPCG), the moment of Public Storm Warning Signal (PSWS) No. 1 is raised by the PAGASA within destination, all vessels of 1, 000 gross tons or below shall not be allowed to sail except to take shelter.




On the other hand, movement of vessels above 1, 000 gross tons is left to the discretion and responsibility of the ship owner and master when PSWS No. 1 is hoisted within its point of origin or route or point of destination. Along this line, vessels of any tonnage shall not sail, except to take shelter, when PSWS No. 2 higher is hoisted within its origin or route or point of destination.

Preventive measures shall be applied to fishermen who refused to leave the area despite declaration by the Municipal Mayor of forced evacuation. If the fishermen do not adhere to the order of forced evacuation and found within the danger or target area, or when the fishermen go back to their homes or affected areas without an order issued allowing their return, they may be arrested or forcibly be taken to ensure their safety.

Fishermen shall only be allowed to return or go back to their homes, if still possible, upon the order of the Municipal Mayor through recommendation by LDRRMC, in consultation with different government agencies concerned, after it has been determined that danger no longer exists therein.

SECTION VII. COORDINATION. All adopted emergency measures, such as the approved barangay and municipal disaster plan and contingency plan and also the DREAM ALPHA protocol, shall be coordinated and collaborated between the LGU-Dumalinao, LDRRMC, the Barangay DRRMC, the Philippine National Police, Bureau of Fire Protection, and the members of the Incident Management Team for the effective and efficient implementation of this ordinance. Other coordination and consideration to be observed in the implementation of preemptive or forced evacuation shall include but shall not be limited to the following:

- a. The LGU-Dumalinao may provide additional equipment and paraphernalia to the response team as maybe needed to properly and effectively respond to the needs of those affected by the calamity and/or manman or natural disasters. Response teams must be equipped with proper trainings and the necessary equipment's suitable for a particular situation.
- b. Medical personnel shall be on standby at the evacuation sites to provide medical assistance to the vulnerable and marginalized groups, as well as the response team and other persons that may need medical attention. In the aftermath of the calamity and/or man-made or natural disaster, the LGU-Dumalinao shall extend to the victims for their rapid recovery.
- c. Social services teams shall also be on an alert status to monitor and provide services and necessary materials such as but not limited to beddings,



blankets, clothing, foods and medicine, to the victims in times of disasters or calamity.

- d. The Incident Management Team (IMT) shall be on standby in the designated evacuation centres/sites to monitor the evacuees and provide services and necessary food and non-food materials based on the Incident Management Protocols.
- e. Mobilize the Office of the Municipal Agriculture personnel to take custody of and transport the affected animals to any government animal control facility.
- f. The Philippine National Police, Bureau of Fire Protection, Armed Forces of the Philippines, and other uniform personnel shall assist and provide public safety measures during the implementation of pre-emptive and forced evacuation.
- g. There will be designated areas where the municipal government vehicles used in evacuation are on standby to transport residents to the identified evacuation sites/centers during the implementation of forced evacuation. Likewise, the vehicle that will transport the affected residents to evacuation sites or centers and vehicles used shall have the necessary banners or signs/logos for immediate identification.

SECTION VIII. MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION OF EVACUATION SITES/CENTRES. Evacuation Sites/Centres must be equipped with complete facilities such as safe potable water, a kitchen, separate toilets for males and females, child-friendly space, and there should be a standby generator. Likewise, the evacuation centers shall provide the basic needs of evacuees, such as but not limited to healthy, safe, and nutritious food, safe water, clothing, blankets, health care, and other services needed to ensure a safe and healthy environment in the evacuation center.

SECTION IX. IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS (IRR). Within thirty (30) days from the approval of this ordinance, the necessary rules and regulations may be issued by the Office of the Municipal Mayor for the effective implementation of this ordinance.

SECTION X. PENALTY CLAUSE. Any persons found to violate any of the pertinent provisions of this Ordinance shall be subjected to a fine not less than Php500.00 but not exceeding Php2, 500.00 or imprisonment of not less than 30 days but not exceeding 6 months, or both, at the discretion of the court.

If the violator is a public official, the foregoing penalty shall be without prejudice to administrative sanctions as may imposed under existing laws, rules and regulations.

SECTION XI. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If for any reason, any part or provision of this Ordinance shall be found to be unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions thereof which are not affected thereby, shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION XII. REPEALING CLAUSE. All ordinances, rules and regulations, or parts thereof, in conflict with, or inconsistent to the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION XIII. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after review and approval.

EXCERPTS FROM THE MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING OF THE PROPOSED ORDINANCES OF THE 12TH SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF DUMALINAO, ZAMBOANGA DEL SUR ON JANUARY 19, 2024, HELD AT MUNICIPAL GYMNASIUM, DUMALINAO ZAMBOANGA DEL SUR.

A. OPENING SESSION.

The meeting commenced with an opening prayer was given by Hon. Vicente F. Munion and followed by the singing of the Philippine national anthem led by Hon. Aileen P. Lira.

The Municipal Vice Mayor Hon. Wilfredo L. Malong Sr., given an welcome remarks.

- Acknowledgement of participants and speakers.
- Acknowledgement of the participants and the key speakers was given by. Mr. Darrylle Angelou Dalid the acting Secretary to the Sanggunian.
- Overview of the conduct of Public Hearing.
- Hon. Hermes Cabales the chairman on Committee on Rules and Good Government and Public Accountability gives an overview of the conduct of the public hearing.

B. PRESENTATION OF PROPOSED ORDINANCES.

- 1. Hon. Frederick R. Balandra presented the proposed ordinance enacting the Municipal Code pursuing a Public-Private Partnership for the people initiative for Local Government Unit (LGU P4) approach towards developments, providing for the procedure for the selecting the private sector proponent adopting a contract management framework and providing appropriation and for other purposes and discussed the important features and purpose of the ordinance that seeks to foster collaboration between the public and private sectors to drive sustainable development and address community needs.
- 2. Hon. Ma. Gemma C. Albiso presented the proposed ordinance providing an additional guidelines of Safe Spaces Act in the Municipal Ordinance No. 2017-05-413, otherwise known as the modified GAD Code of Dumalinao, to prevent



the occurrence of gender-based sexual harassment in streets and public spaces, online, in workplaces and in educational and training institutions in the Municipality of Dumalinao, Zamboanga del Sur, and appropriating funds for the purpose thereof and discussed the important features and purposes in ensuring women's right and protection and their full participation in the community.

- 3. Hon. Ma. Gemma C. Albiso presented the proposed ordinance amending the Children's Code of the Municipality of Dumalinao, Zamboanga del Sur, and explained important matters to ensure the protection of children against all forms of abuse, exploitation and discrimination.
- 4. Hon. Ma. Gemma C. Albiso presented the proposed ordinance prioritizing the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) beneficiaries including the existing households for convergence provision pursuant to RA 11310, and appropriating funds and for other purposes and deliberated the social assistance program, which is to provide support to the poor family to alleviate their needs and enables the children to be able to obtain their academic needs such as educational materials and supplies.
- 5. Hon. Hermes B. Cabales presented the proposed ordinance amending certain sections and imposition of new fees and charges of Municipal Ordinance No. 2014-08-384 as amended by Municipal Ordinance No. 2020-03-441 otherwise known as the Revenue Code of the Municipality of Dumalinao, Zamboanga del Sur.
- 6. Hon. Jelito R. Peñonal presented the proposed ordinance mandating the enforcement of pre-emptive and forced evacuation during emergency situations caused by man-made or natural disaster and providing additional guidelines thereof, amending for the purpose ordinance no. 2017-05-419 of the Municipality of Dumalinao, Zamboanga del Sur.
- 7. Hon. Romeo D. Parila presented the proposed ordinance, prescribing proper management, containment and control of African Swine Fever (ASF) in the Municipality of Dumalinao, Zamboanga del Sur, imposing penalties for violations and appropriating funds thereof and explained the purpose and importance of the guidelines and implementation of African Swine Fever (ASF) in the locality, which is to avoid highly contagious viral disease of domestic and wild pigs.
- 8. Hon. Romeo D. Parila presented the proposed ordinance preserving and promoting the indigenous culture and arts in the Municipality of Dumalinao, Zamboanga del Sur, providing funds thereof.
- 9. Hon. Jelito R. Peñonal presented the proposed ordinance requiring all businesses, commercial complexes, and establishments considered as high risk



to install Close Circuit Television (CCTV) camera and providing penalties for violation thereof. According to Hon. Jelito R. Peñonal the purpose of this ordinance is to help and prevent the occurrence of the crime rate in the locality and to ensure the public with regards to the safety of the community.

10. Hon. Romeo G. Ligan presented the proposed ordinance declaring and establishing the Four Hundred Thirty-Nine Thousand Six Hundred (439,600) square meters coastal area of Zone 1 as Mangrove Protected Area, providing funds and penalties for the purpose thereof.

C. OPEN FORUM.

The members of the LIGA ng mga Barangay has no questions, qualifications, and comments to the different proposed ordinances by the Sangguniang Bayan of Dumalinao.

D. CLOSING REMARKS.

The closing remarks was given by Hon. Hermes B. Cabales.

A closing prayer was given by Hon. Romeo D. Parila.



Albiso presented the proposed ordinance providing an additional guidelines of Safe Spaces Act in the Municipal Ordinance No. 2017-05-413, otherwise known as the modified GAD Code of Dumalinao, to prevent the occurrence of gender-based sexual harassment in streets and public spaces, online, in workplaces and in educational and training institutions in the Municipality of Dumalinao, Zamboanga del Sur, and appropriating funds for



the purpose thereof and discussed the important features and purposes in ensuring women's right and protection and their full participation in the community.

- 3. Hon. Ma. Gemma C. Albiso presented the proposed ordinance amending the Children's Code of the Municipality of Dumalinao, Zamboanga del Sur, and explained important matters to ensure the protection of children against all forms of abuse, exploitation and discrimination.
- 4. Hon. Ma. Gemma C. Albiso presented the proposed ordinance prioritizing the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) beneficiaries including the existing households for convergence provision pursuant to RA 11310, and appropriating funds and for other purposes and deliberated the social assistance program, which is to provide support to the poor family to alleviate their needs and enables the children to be able to obtain their academic needs such as educational materials and supplies.
- 5. Hon. Hermes B. Cabales presented the proposed ordinance amending certain sections and imposition of new fees and charges of Municipal Ordinance No. 2014-08-384 as amended by Municipal Ordinance No. 2020-03-441 otherwise known as the Revenue Code of the Municipality of Dumalinao, Zamboanga del Sur.



ORDINANCE NO. 2017-05-415

"AN ORDINANCE IMPLEMENTING FORCED EVACUATION AS A RESORT WHEN A DISASTER OR EMERGENCY HAS BEEN DECLARED IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF DUMALINAO, ZAMBOANGA DEL SUR AND WHEN DANGER OF LOSS OF LIVES AND PROPERTIES BECOMES IMMINENT DESIGNATING EVACUATION SITES OR CENTERS, PROVIDING PENALTIES THEREFORE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

Be it enacted by the Sangguniang Bayan of Dumalinao, Zamboanga del Sur that:

SECTION 1. DECLARATION OF POLICY. - It is the declared policy of the Municipality of Dumalinao to protect the lives of its residents at all times and whenever possible mitigate the effects of man-made and natural disasters within the locality.

SECTION 2. DEFINITION OF TERMS. -As used in this Ordinance:

2.1. **Disaster** - means the result of a natural or man-made event which causes loss of life, injury and property damage, including but not limited to natural disasters such as hurricane, tornado, storm, flood, high wind and other weather related events, and man-made disasters, including but not limited to nuclear

power plant incidents, oil spills, explosion, civil disturbances, public calamity, acts of terrorism, hostile military action and other events related thereto;

Imminent Danger -means an immediate threat of harm;

Evacuation - means an operation whereby all or part of a particular population is temporarily relocated, whether individually or in an organized manner, from an area in which a disaster or emergency has been declared and is considered dangerous for health or safety of the public;

Gender-Based Violence (GBV) - is any harmful act that is perpetrated against a person's will on the basis of gender differences. GBV is already pervasive in times of peace but may escalate during emergency situations.

2.5. Forced Evacuation - means an evacuation ordered as a resort when a disaster or emergency has been declared and danger of loss of life is imminent and conditions exist that critically imperil or endanger the lives of those in a defined area.

SECTION 3. TRAINING AND ORIENTATION ON DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT. - The Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO) shall organize and conduct training and orientation on the possible man-made, natural hazards, vulnerabilities and climate change risks as well as knowledge management activities in disaster risk reduction and management within the locality at least twice a year during summer and intensified at the onset of rainy season.

During the aforesaid trainings and orientations, the MDRRMO shall also discuss and highlight in vernacular, RA 10121, otherwise known as the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010; DILG MC No. 2012-35 dated 21 February 2012 regarding the Guidelines in Ensuring Public Safety During Man-Made and Natural Disasters; and other laws, rules and regulations on disaster risk reduction management.

The MDRRMO is also encouraged to conceptualize posters, newsletters, brochures and pamphlets regarding disaster risk reduction and management and cause the same to be posted at the conspicuous places of the city and/or, if possible, disseminate through radio and TV advertisements.

SECTION 4. FORCED EVACUATION. – If upon the assessment or determination of the MDRRMC, forced evacuation of local residents is already necessary, said Council shall immediately make recommendation of such assessment or determination.

On the basis of such recommendation, the Municipal Mayor shall immediately declare the implementation/enforcement of forced evacuation which shall include but shall not be limited to the following:

The designated area where vehicles provided by the Municipal government are waiting to transport local residents to the identified evacuation centers;

Evacuation centers or such places where the evacuated local residents will be temporarily taken;

The necessity of the evacuated local residents to stay in the aforesaid evacuation centers until there be issuance declaring that the imminent danger within the affected area is no longer there, if this is still possible; and Measures ensuring the safety of local residents in the evacuation areas.

However, immediately after declaration of forced evacuation but before actual implementation/enforcement thereof, the Municipal government shall see to it that the local residents are informed of the need for them to evacuate and that there is no other alternative way to ensure their safety.

SECTION 5. PREVENTION OF GENDER BASED VIOLENCE (GBV) IN EVACUATION CENTERS. – During disasters either man made or natural disaster such as typhoon or flood, the open living conditions in evacuation centers on stress and breakdown of community norms and protection put women and their children at risk of Gender Based Violence. Women are exposed to all forms of sex-related violence and children are also exposed to exploitation and child trafficking. Incidents of Gender Based Violence are expected to increase due to stress and breakdown of community norms and protection. The following measures shall be considered:

- a. The designated area where vehicles provided by the municipal government are waiting to transport local residents to the identified evacuation centers:
- b. To construct a separate and secure latrines and bathing facilities and breastfeeding room with adequate lighting for women and mothers.
- c. Ensure free access of pregnant women and mothers to ante-natal and post natal care.
- d. Conduct strong information campaign on the merits of Family Planning alongside responsible parenting sessions.

Recruit women volunteers to join the rescue team to do the rescue of women during disasters.

Capacitate Evacuation Center's staff in the prevention and management of Gender Based Violence (GBV).

SECTION 6. ENLISTMENT OF ASSISTANCE OF LGU OFFICES AND OTHER GOVERNMENT AGENCIES. – In declaring the implementation/enforcement of forced evacuation, the members of the PNP, AFP, BFP and BJMP assigned

within the affected locality are thereby enlisted by the Municipal Mayor and becomes automatic members of the MDRRMC.

All emergency measures adopted shall be a coordinative and collaborative effort between the Municipal Government, BFP, PNP and AFP units.

SECTION 7. REFUSAL OF LOCAL RESIDENTS TO LEAVE THEIR HOMES OR, AFTER EVACUATING GO BACK THEREIN WITHOUT AN ORDER ALLOWING THEM TO DO SO. – In the event that the local residents refuse to leave their homes, or after evacuating, go back to their homes/affected areas without an order issued to this effect, the Municipal Government as well as the members of the MDRRMC, BDRRMC, LGU Offices, mobilized units of the PNP, AFP, BFP and the BJMP may use such physical force that is commensurate under the circumstances, without discrimination and with conscious attention to the needs of vulnerable sectors such as children, women, the elderly and persons with disabilities, with the end view that lives are safely secured.

SECTION 8. EVACUATION SITES OR CENTERS are hereunder specified, to wit:

- SCHOOLS except the Rebokon Agricultural Vocational High School (RAVHS);
 - 2. BARANGAY HALLS;
 - 3. MULTI-PURPOSE HALLS;
 - 4. CHURCHES; and
 - 5. PUROK HALLS

SECTION 9. BUDGETARY REQUIREMENTS – Budgetary requirements due for this Ordinance shall be chargeable from the 5% Disaster Risk Reduction Management Fund (DRRMF).

SECTION 10. PENALTY CLAUSE – Any public official found to violate any of the pertinent provisions of this Ordinance shall be subjected to criminal and/or administrative sanctions as may be imposed under existing laws, rules and regulations.

SECTION 11. REPEALING CLAUSE – Any ordinance, order, memorandum, rule and regulation which is inconsistent with the provision of this Ordinance is hereby modified or repealed accordingly.

SECTION 12. EFFECTIVITY – This Ordinance shall take effect after careful review and approval by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan.

ORDINANCE NO. 2017-05-419

AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING THE GUIDELINES ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PRE-EMPTIVE EVACUATION IN DUMALINAO, ZAMBOANGA DEL SUR AS A RESORT WHEN A DISASTER OR EMERGENCY IS ABOUT TO OCCUR AND DANGER OF LOSS OF LIVES BECOMES IMMINENT.

Be it Ordanied by the Sangguniang Byan of Dumalinao, Zamboanga del sur, in session assembled, that:

Section 1. Declaration of Policy. – It is the declared policy of the Municipality of Dumalinao the lives and properties of its residents at all times and whenever possible, mitigate the effects of human-induced and natural disasters within the locality.

Section 2. Definition of Terms. – As used in this Ordinance, the following terms are hereby defined:

a. Disaster – a serious disruption of the functioning of a community or a society involving widespread human, material, economic or environmental losses and impacts, which exceeds the ability of the affected community or society to cope using its own resources. Disasters are often described as a result of the combination of the exposure to a hazard; the conditions of vulnerability that are present; and insufficient capacity or measures to reduce or cope with the potential negative consequences. Disaster impacts may include loss of life, injury, disease and other negative effects on human, physical, mental and social well-being, together with damage to property,

- destruction of assets, loss of services, social and economic disruption and environmental degradation;
- b. Evacuation means an operation whereby all or part of a particular population is temporarily relocated, whether voluntarily or in an organized manner, from an area that has been or is about to be struck by a disaster, to a place considered not dangerous for health or safety;
- c. Imminent Danger means any condition in any place such that a danger exists which could reasonably be expected to cause death or serious physical harm immediately upon or before the occurrence of any human- induced or natural disasters;
- d. Incident commander- is the person responsible for all aspects of an emergency response; including quickly developing incident objectives, managing all incident operations, application of resources as well as responsibility for all persons involved. The Incident Commander sets priorities and defines the organization of the incident response teams and the overall incident action plan. The role of the incident commander may be assumed by senior or higher qualified officers upon their arrival or as the situation dictates. Even if subordinate positions are not assigned, the incident commander position will always be designated or assumed. The incident commander may, at their own discretion, assign individuals, who may be from the same agency or from assisting agencies, to subordinate or specific positions for the duration of the emergency;
- **e. Pre-emptive Evacuation-** an order from competent authority to forcibly evacuate residents to an appropriate evacuation destination to forestall their exposure to an imminent disaster.
- Section 3. Procedures on Enforcement of Pre-Emptive Evacuation. Upon assessment or determination of the Incident Commander (IC) that pre-emptive evacuation of local residents is necessary, the same shall immediately enforce pre-emptive evacuation of affected residents.
- **Section 4. Mobilization of Other Government Agencies.** In declaring the enforcement of forced evacuation, the members of the Philippine National Police (PNP), the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP), Philippine Coast Guard (PCG), Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) assigned within the affected locality may be mobilized by the Municipal Mayor.
- Section 5. Refusal of Local Residents to Leave Their Homes or, After Evacuating, Go Back Therein Without An Order Allowing Them to Do So. In the event that local residents refuse to leave their homes or, after evacuating, go back to their homes/affected areas without an order issued to this effect, the city government as well as the members of the mobilized units may use such reasonable force that is commensurate under the circumstances, to evacuate them from the area, without discrimination and with conscious attention to the needs of vulnerable and marginalized sectors such as children, women, the elderly and persons with disabilities, with the end view that lives are safely secured.

Any person who willfully and deliberately disregard or opposed the order of forced evacuation issued by the City Mayor shall release the latter from any liablility for the former's injury or death attributed to his disobedience. During evacuation, priority shall

be given to those persons or residents who willfully comply with the order of forced evacuation.

Section 6. Training and Orientation on Pre-Emptive Evacuation Procedures. — The Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office MDRRMO shall organize and facilitate the conduct of training and orientation at least once a year on pre-emptive and forced evacuation on possible human-induced and natural hazards.

During the aforesaid trainings and orientations, the MDRRMO shall also discuss and highlight in a dialect understandable and spoken by the residents topics on RA 10121, otherwise known as the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010; DILG MC No. 2012-35 dated February 21, 2012 regarding the Guidelines in Ensuring Public Safety During Man-Made and Natural Disasters; this Ordinance; and other laws, rules and regulations on disaster risk reduction and management.

The MDRRMO shall also conceptualize posters, newsletters, brochures and pamphlets regarding disaster risk reduction and management and cause the same to beposted at the conspicuous places of the city and/or, if possible, disseminate through quad media.

Section 7. Reportorial Clause. — Within twenty four (24) hours upon the declaration of pre-emptive evacuation, the Municipal Mayor shall report the declaration to the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (MDRRMC) and Sangguniang Bayan.

Section 8. Separability Clause. – If, for any reason, any part or provision of this Ordinance shall be found to be unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions thereof which are not affected thereby, shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 9. Penalty Clause – Any public official found to violate any of the pertinent provisions of this Ordinance shall be subjected to criminal and/or administrative sanctions as may be imposed under existing laws, rules and regulations.

Section 10. Repealing Clause. – All ordinances, rules and regulations, or parts thereof, in conflict with, or inconsistent to the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 11. – Effectivity Clause. – This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after fifteen (15) days following the completion of its full publication in any newspaper of general circulation in the Province of Zamboanga del Sur.

The penalty imposed is within their powers."
